If commercial losses are 45% and residential are 38%, then why would commercial not bear a larger burden of the tax increase? It hardly seems fair for residential customers to be responsible for the same 10% increase as commercial customers whose losses account for more of the deficit.

A 10% increase will be a hardship and means we go without something else (like food) or be forced to move out of the area.
